Examples of projects we have already helped with

The Lady Forester Centre, Broseley.

Grant of £2,434 to enable the purchase of two specialist beds and mattresses for elderly patients use at the Centre.

Carer Connect, Much Wenlock.

Grant of £1,800 towards the cost of monthly meetings enabling support to a group of dedicated unpaid carers, providing an opportunity to connect with other carers and support services.

Lingen Davies Cancer Fund, Shrewsbury.

Grant of £1,000 to their LiveLife Cancer Awareness Service to promote better understanding of the signs and symptoms of cancer.
